Course materials include load exercises and load charts for the crane with which the individual training is working.

Hands-On Safety Training will take up more than half of the course curriculum. The practical training part is the most helpful method to developing and improving personal skill levels. Only experienced journeyman crane instructors are chosen to teach the courses. Our instructors have numerous years of experience in the industry.

Optional testing mechanisms are offered for all of our courses. Students will normally write tests both before and after training. A test for skills is generally administered for programs that consist of H.O.S.T. Trainees will be graded and tested.

We offer certified training programs for the following cranes: Lattice Boom/Crawler Cranes; Fixed and Swing Cab Mobile Hydraulic Cranes; Rigging / Signalperson Certification and Training; Articulated Boom / Knuckleboom Cranes; Certification & Testing; and In-The-Seat Training.
