Telehandler Training Courses Guelph - Employers are responsible for making sure that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work proficiently making use of telehandler equipment. The skill level of staff should be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers need to provide training so that employees obtain the required level of ability. The level of responsibility of the person has to be considered when training is offered. Effective training would remedy whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training could be undertaken by hiring an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Local, federal and state/provincial regulations set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not deal with such topics as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, making use of other attachments, or the utilization of rotating equipment. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

Similar to whichever machinery, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The equipment inevitably will suffer wear over time. Proper maintenance is vital to ensuring safe use of the telehandler equipment. Checks and inspections are essential to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators have to have machine-specific training to be able to monitor, prevent and rectify problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Personnel require experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be seriously viewed and complied with, considering such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machinery along with the owner of the equipment share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is normally done by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use inspections are normally done by the user.
